<u>Creation: Who made the world?</u>
<u>Digging Deeper.</u>

Background Information

The story of Creation opens the Bible. For Christians, it sets out the relationship between God, the universe and all life. It reveals God as powerful, creative, orderly, and concerned with the role and value of life.

The passage is vivid, energetic and memorable. It is likely to have been passed on orally through generations, and probably edited into its written form around the eighth century BCE. The passage says a great deal about the kind of God Christians believe in, and many Christians would say it was written to glorify this God, reminding believers of their dependence on God for everything.

Christians may use this opening chapter of the Bible in church and in their private prayers. They use it to remind themselves about what God is like, and when they think about the wonders of the world we live in. They might be inspired to be creative, or to care for the Earth and its creatures, or to study the world in order to understand it better.

- Talk about living in an amazing world.


Most children will:

- Talk, think and ask questions about living in an amazing world.
