This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

#### Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

All pupils at St Mary's CE Primary school receive:

- At least one hour of music teaching every week, which can be in the form of short sessions spread out across the week.
- Instrument tuition on a tuned instrument (Years 1-6) taught by a professional musician.
- Opportunities for composition with rhythmic and melodic instruments.
- Opportunities to sing for pleasure and to an audience.

Children in Years 1 and 2 learn the recorder as a whole class ensemble taught by a music specialist (Caroline Szram). They have opportunities to perform and compose throughout the year.

In Key Stage 2, the pupils learn either the violin or piano throughout the Keystage, and take examinations at the end of the Primary years/Key Stage 2

#### Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At St Mary's we currently offer additional opportunities for key board lessons during lunchtime, and choir after school hours. We have a thriving choir who meet weekly and perform at the O2 (Young Voices) and for local events (Hospice at Christmas, Age Concern, local Care Home).

All music is funded by the school, but parents have the opportunity to purchase additional lessons for their child outside of school hours.
